Initially it was intended that the guns would be moved by pack horse; however, following the unit's arrival in Port Battle for Kokoda in early October it Battle for Kokoda became clear that horses would be unsuited to the humid conditions in New Guinea with the guns to be moved by jeeps and native carriers instead. Another strip at Merauke on the south coast of Dutch New Guinea was authorised on 22 June to protect the western flank. The recapture of Kokoda on 2 November was not the end of the campaign to expel the Japanese invaders from Papua.
