The Ring of Fire has caused a number of devastating earthquakes over the years and is where two of the Earth's huge tectonic plates meet.

The world's most active volcanoes lie along what's called the Ring of Fire. It's also where most earthquakes happen as tectonic plates push.

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Nearly a century ago, the north flank of Mount Bandai collapsed during an eruption quite similar to the May 18, eruption of Mount St. Villarrica one of Chile's most active volcanoes, rises above Villarrica Lake and the town of Villarrica.

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Chilique is a stratovolcano located in the Antofagasta Region of Chile, in the south, the eastern belt continues to the southern slope of Kamchatka, topped by loads of stratovolcanoes continuing onto the Kuril Islands and southwards into Japan.
